
We have seen God at work in our lives despite some challenges. We have been blessed, as a church, to have congregation and staff with such faith, love, and patience in wonderful ways.



Word of the Day

When I was on internship, I was instructed to come up with a family project that invited deeper engagement for the season of Epiphany. While Advent and Lent have a ton of resources to draw from, the same cannot be said for Epiphany. After much consternation, I came up with a star made of felt and little felt circles that each had a symbol on it, highlighting something in the gospel readings that spanned from Epiphany to the Transfiguration. While I hoped the accompanying devotions and craftiness would add meaning to our families with small children, an unexpected blessing was my own deeper engagement with the season of Epiphany and what it means for its place in the liturgical calendar of our church. I had my own Epiphany as what was revealed to me was how each gospel reading contributed to the growing light, that is, the expanding understanding of who Jesus is and why he came. The light that shone from the manger bed increases in brightness and spills out into the world. And what happens as light increases? We see better. Objects come into clearer focus.

In the northern hemisphere, as days lengthen and light lingers longer, understanding of Jesus increases and comes into clearer focus every time we gather for worship. The light grows with each reading of scripture, with each hymn sung, with each sermon proclaimed. The light grows each week until it will reach its apex at the Transfiguration when the glory of Jesus will be revealed in all its fullness for a bright, shining, terrifying moment.

May the light of Christ grow in brilliance for you and bless your worship in this Epiphany season with meaningful revelation.

Sloppy Joes and Valentines Bingo





Come to the Table - No Report

Endowment – Per Faith's Endowment Resolution Guideline, \$3,885 will be distributed for church related projects in 2023. Each area should have a minimum allocation of \$971.25 for 2023. Endowment Fund distributions should be to the following areas:

1. 25% or more to grants for ELCA Seminaries, youth attending national or

local youth events or bible camps.

- 2. 25% or more to ELCA missions around the world.
- 3. 25% or more toward capital improvements or Faith debt reduction.
- 4. 25% toward any of the above areas or another area not mentioned.

Fellowship - Bingo is being planned for February 19.

Worship and Music – Ash Wednesday service will be at 6:00 p.m. with Holy Communion and the distribution of ashes. Wednesdays in Lent will have soup supper at 5 followed by devotions in fellowship hall at 6:00. Holy week – Palm Sunday Holy Communion service at 10:30, Maundy Thursday at 7:00 p.m. with foot washing – individual brings his own towel. Holy Communion and alter stripping. Good Friday at 7:00 p.m. stations of the cross and no communion

Easter - Holy Communion followed by brunch. Confirmation during Easter service. Next meeting March 14 at 5:30 p.m.

pastor's report. Seconded by Sandy Lawson. Motion carried.


Motion to adjourn: Steve Sanderson made a motion to adjourn the meeting.
